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## What are my options after Upper V?


Until the age of 18 you have to stay in some form of education or training, but you can choose from a range of options:

- stay in full-time education, e.g. at a college, doing A Levels, T Levels, BTECs
- start an apprenticeship or traineeship
- Paid work or volunteer for 20 hours or more a week, whilst also in part-time education or training.





## 1. A-Levels



- Those who want to go to university
- Also good for those wanting to keep options open
- Pursue your favourite or strongest subjects
- Usually assessed by exams
- Three or more subjects at college
- Two-year course
- Colleges will often ask for GCSE grades higher than 6 or even 7 in those A Level subjects, in addition to a number of Good Pass Grade 5s
- A-Levels are still valued by employers as they show a high level of education





## 2. T-Levels



- Designed between colleges and employers to provide skills and work experience of industry
- Combination of classroom (80%) and workplace learning (20%)
- Provides 45 days on placement
- Usually assessed by projects, assignments and exams
- Two-year course
- Entry requirements dependent on course; will deliver G4
   English and Maths if not achieved earlier
- One T-Level is worth three A-Levels
- Can lead to work opportunities, high-level apprenticeships and university





### 3. BTECs



- Business and Technology Education Council courses
- Designed to be high-level industry standard qualifications, respected by employers
- Full-time course
- Wide range of levels Level 2 (GCSE) Level 3 (A-Level)
- Assessed by mixture of internal/external assessments
- Pass, Merit, Distinction or Distinction \*
- Entry requirements are specific to subject
- Can lead to industry qualifications, next level of BTEC, university, work opportunities





# 4. Apprenticeships



- Employed in a real job whilst earning a qualification
- Be an employee earning a wage and getting holiday pay
- Work alongside experienced staff
- Intermediate = five good GCSEs (1yr-18months)
- Advanced = two A-Levels (2yrs)
- Higher = foundation degree level (3-6yrs)
- Degree Level Apprenticeship (3-6yrs)
- Entry requirements differ per apprenticeship levels





## 5. NVQs



- National Vocational Qualification
- Good for those who know now what job they want
- Available in 1000+ subjects from plumbing to hairdressing
- Five levels of NVQ no entry requirements from high school although progress steps through NVQ may need to be taken
- Assessed through portfolio and observation
- Usually a one-year course per NVQ, completed At college, work or both
- Develops skills for future employment





#### Post 16 Education for Pupils with Additional Needs

- Pupils with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) have had their transition review meetings, designed to support you to make the move to post 16 education.
- Your EHCP will be updated by the Local Authority and a Final Plan issued by them before 31 March, it
  will move with you into post 16 education. Your EHCP will outline your support needs and let the post 16
  provider know exactly what you need to successfully engage in learning and complete the course.
- Some pupils may have Access Arrangements to support them in examinations and assessments, this might include a reader, scribe or extra time. It is important that you let the new setting know that you have Access Arrangements so that they can support you appropriately from the beginning. The setting will need evidence from us that you have formal arrangements, we can release the paperwork to your new setting as long as we have yours and your parents' written permission. On the subsequent pages there is a data protection form for you to fill out and return to us. We will hold this on record which will enable us to action a request from your new setting in September.





#### **Further Education College or Sixth Form College**

 Local colleges offer a wide variety of qualifications intended to be accessible to a diverse range of learners of all abilities usually through a dedicated Additional Learning Support Team. Support enables you to work towards the outcomes in your Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), although support can also be available if you do not have an EHCP but have some additional needs.

#### **Training providers**

- Training providers are an alternative way of learning and gaining vocational qualifications. They
  usually offer study programmes, traineeships and apprenticeships. The training is usually
  combined with work experience. Training courses start at Entry/Foundation Level and progress
  onto Level 3. Training Providers will provide you with a key worker to help and support your
  learning and review your EHCP.






